



IMPORTANT MESSAGE TO ALL RESIDENTS

Flightpath Watch has produced a substantive document showing that there are many and important discrepancies between the Conditions of Approval of the Extended Hours at Biggin Hill Airport and the document produced by the Airport (BHAL) and included in the Deed of Variation (referred to as the MIL).

These are important legal matters that need correction and we do not believe that Bromley Council has given them full consideration. There is great danger that the impending Five-Year Review of the Noise Action Plan (NAP) will be taken (if approved by the Council) as corroboration that all is well and, in all likelihood, these discrepancies (all disadvantageous to residents) will then become the norm.

The Airport has had the benefit of the increase in hours, with the consequent arrival of much larger intercontinental aircraft into the borough BUT the residents have not had any of the promised mitigants complied with.

Most alarmingly, Bromley Council has decided not to pass our document to the CAA, who have been contracted to advise. Only the document produced by the Airport has been supplied. We also know that some acoustic experts have been appointed, but this can only play to the residents' disadvantage, since the acoustic measure accepted by Bromley Council is wide and average.

THIS CALLS FOR ACTION FROM ALL OF US

Please make your voice heard and ask for Bromley Council:

1. to appoint External Legal Counsel to correct all the errors and misinterpretations contained in the MIL,
2. to enforce all the conditions of approval that have yet to be complied with, five years after the granting of the new hours,
3. to maintain the promised cap of 50,000 movements per annum, which BHAL considers expired.
